16. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Craig Stephenson reported that Oklahoma Main Street held their 24th Annual Main Street Awards and once again Ponca City Main Street was to be commended. There

were three finalists and two top award winners. In the Best Community Education/Public Awareness Activity the Ponca City Main Street's "Magic School Bus Tour through Adventures in History" garnered top honors. Our very own Jayne Detten was selected as the Program Manager of the Year. Congratulations to Jayne and for all Ponca Main Street as they also had a finalist in the Best Façade Rehabilitation Under \$10,000 for the "Pine Street Wood Shop".

The City is planning a ribbon cutting for both the Lake Ponca Bridge project and the Lake Ponca Lift Station and Restroom project on May 28, 2013 at 4:00 p.m.

May 12 - 18, 2013 is National Police Week. May 15, 2013 is Peace Officer's Memorial Day, and in 1962 President John F Kennedy signed into public law that the week in which May 15th falls is National Police Week. The law, amended a few times since, now directs that the United States flag be displayed at half-staff on all government buildings on May 15th each year.

This year's Take 25 event will take place Friday, May 24, 2013 at the Ponca City Aquatic and Family Center-YMCA from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. A myriad of fun events is planned. Safety items and brochures will be distributed and refreshments served. This is the second year for the event to be held locally.

The Environmental Services Department is beginning to provide education in the form of news briefs to promote water conservation to the residents of the community. The water well fields and water plant are in good shape, but it is prudent that we educate and promote water conservation as water is an extremely valuable resource.

May is National Physical Fitness and Sports Month. Just 30 minutes of moderate exercise per day, five days a week, can help adults reduce their risks for high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, heart disease and Type 2 diabetes – all of which affect Oklahomans at a higher rate than the national average. Health experts encourage children and teenagers to get at least 60 minutes of physical activity each day to improve muscular fitness, along with bone and heart health.

Steve Brown, pastor of Life Springs Family Worship Center and resident at 3624 Mistletoe, stated he was not aware of 12-month expiration. Brown noted that Life Springs has been in Ponca City since 1992 and the proposed project is a phase 1, 9,000 square foot multi use facility.

Kim Coons, 1108 Kygar Road, clarified she is not asking that the item be denied, but rather argued that traffic counts are very outdated and that many people will be affected by a high volume of traffic. Coons requested that a detailed traffic study be done in June-August period before the zoning is approved.

Steve Brown addressed concerns over a traffic study and disagreed with a recent letter to the editor that asserted no harm would come from waiting until a traffic study is done. Brown clarified that a contract is in place with time restrictions and delay could jeopardize their ability to buy the land.

Susan Dean, 1401 N. 4th Street, stated she is a member of Life Springs Family Worship Center, and that traffic in her neighborhood is busy during certain times and days, like most parts of the City. Dean argued this is the case all across the City, so there is little difference in concern over heavy traffic near the high school or near Kygar Road.

Dale Coons, 1108 Kygar Road, stated he had written a recent letter to the editor and noted that the land in question has been for sale for some time so he felt that delay should not affect a motivated seller and buyer.

DJ Combs, 1 Ramblewood, stated he was the applicant and that they plan on doing much good for Ponca City and constructing a top notch facility.

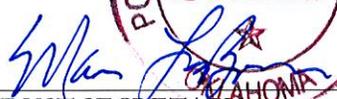

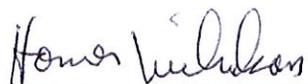
